The article lists 15 affiliates who have been awarded grants, including Planned Parenthood of New York City, Planned Parenthood of Greater Orlando, Planned Parenthood of the Great Northwest, Planned Parenthood of Greater Washington and Northern Idaho, Planned Parenthood of the Columbia/Willamette, Planned Parenthood of Montana, Planned Parenthood of Southwest Oregon, Mt. Baker Planned Parenthood, Planned Parenthood of the Texas Capital Region, Planned Parenthood of Hawaii, Planned Parenthood of the Rocky Mountains, Planned Parenthood League of Massachusetts, Planned Parenthood of the Gulf Coast, Planned Parenthood of Southern New England, and Planned Parenthood of Illinois.
